Shopping Local

Shopping in local businesses not only keeps tax dollars in your community, it helps promote a sense of community and enriches culture, says Kimber Lanning, owner of Stinkweeds music store in central Phoenix. In a recent address to the Tempe Chamber of Commerce, Lanning, who is the director of Local First Arizona, cited the benefits to buying local. For every \$100 spent at a chain store, \$13 remains in the state. For every \$100 spent at a locally owned business \$45 remains in the state.

While it is important to "buy local, support local" we also must keep in mind that those big chains are employing area residents, and some areas of the Valley simply don't have the variety of local businesses needed in their own communities.

Local First Arizona is beginning a campaign to persuade people and companies to shift 10 percent of their spending toward locally owned businesses. That shift could result in 1,600 new jobs and \$15 million in new local wages, Lanning stated. (Con't page 5)




