The Route 66 parade, co-sponsored by the Route 66 Parade Committee, HumanGood, the **Duarte Community Coordinating** Council and the City of Duarte, begins at the northeast corner of Huntington Dr. and Cotter St. proceeds east for one mile ending at Mt. Olive Drive.

Some 1,400 entries including antique and classic cars, schools, churches, equestrians, hogs and marching bands will take part in the event.

High school bands from throughout Southern California will also compete for trophies.



City Manager's **Update**

Note: The City Manager's update is a monthly news source designed to update the Council, staff and community on the various issues that Departments are working on in addition to the status of items raised by the City Council during regular meetings. Following are some of the items from the September 7, 2017

CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

City Communications/Outreach - During the month of August, the Duarte City News was successfully produced and delivered to all residents and local businesses weeks prior to the Parks and Recreation Department fall registration which began August 28. Classes are scheduled to begin September 23. The fall issue features many stories including a Mid-Year Review from Public Safety with reminder emergency Info on how to be prepared for the rainy season and possible landslides due to the previous damage caused by the Fish Fire.

Duarte Photography Contest – Staff members from the City Manager's office structured a citywide Duarte Photography Contest to encourage community engagement through the lense of a camera. Participants are encouraged to capture an image that represents Duarte such as family, landscape, architecture, or nature shots. Three winners will be announced at the October 10 City Council Meeting. The contest began September 1 and ends September 30. The City Hall Social Media Committee will review submittals and select winners during their regular October meeting. Participants are also asked to use the hashtag #DuartePhotoContest to share their submissions. Submissions will also be used for content on select City social media platforms.

City Commissioner Training/Recruitment Informational **Dinner** – The City Commissioner Informational Workshop and Dinner is designed as a refresher course for current commissioners on how to be successful as well as expose potential commissioners to the ins and outs of commission service. Sixteen positions are currently open. The workshop and dinner is scheduled for September 26, 2017 at 5:00 pm at the Duarte Community Center. Applications will be accepted beginning October 2nd for six different commissions. With the assistance of the City Attorney, a finalized presentation has been drafted, as well as a flyer to promote the openings available. An invitation letter was also sent to current commissioners as well.

DCTV/KGEM Agreements Update - Staff continues coordinating with DCTV on its relocation from its current Third Street home to Duarte High School. The move is slated to occur before September 10th with assistance of our facility maintenance staff. The Manager's Office also worked with them to make the Council approved equipment purchases for the new studio location as well. Staff has also developed the agreement between City and Community Media of the Foothills (KGEM) for public access services which will be presented at the September 12th meeting.

COMMUNITY **DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT Planning**

The Habit Burger Grill For the past several months, Staff has been working with representatives of The Habit on a new location in the Buena Vista Marketplace where Starbucks and Curves were previously located. The entire space is now available and they are prepared to move forward. Preliminary plans have been submitted and as soon as Health Department approval is given, the City will receive plans for plan check. The Habit is a strong retailer that should provide another excellent food choice in town. We should know the proposed construction schedule soon. https://www.habitburger.com/

City of Hope Clinical Research Unit (1500 Duarte **Road)** – On August 21, 2017 the Planning Commission approved a 3,122 square foot addition to the City of Hope's Familian Building.


The expansion is part of a full remodel to the Familian Building to create the new Clinical Research Unit. The expansion will provide a welcoming environment and better care for City of Hope's patients. The project is currently under Building and Safety review.

Duarte Mixed Use Project (1415, 1423, and 1437 Huntington) – The proposed Duarte Mixed Use project has been scheduled for review before the Architectural Review Board and then the Planning Commission at two separate meetings in September. The Architectural Review Board will make a recommendation to the Planning Commission for it's consideration, the Planning Commission will make the final approval. The project includes a combination of retail, office and residential apartments, constructed around a multi-story parking garage. The mixed use project is the first to be implemented under the Town Center Specific Plan and has been designed to meet the goals and vision of the specific plan.

Duarte Inn (1202 Huntington Drive) – The property owner has proposed an exterior remodel for the Duarte Inn motel and retail/ office building on the property. The applicant went through several rounds of design discussion with Staff and was not able to present an acceptable concept. In mid-August the property owner selected a new architect to create a design scheme for the center that meets Duarte's architectural standards. Staff just received a series of design concepts for consideration and comment and these, which is the first step towards design selection.














Duarte's 60th Anniversary Celebration Picnic


Fun and informative booth displays and activities will include local college and university information, drug awareness and prevention literature, and many booths will provide giveaways.



Monuments and Entry Signs Public Works and Planning Divisions met with the sign contractor in late August to tour typical locations where new signs are to be installed.

Both Divisions are refining the details behind the proposed locations, including: power feeds, median dimensions/tolerances, visibility conflicts and other encumbrances. A landscape architect has been engaged to provide prototypical landscape designs for the ground areas around monument signs.

PUBLIC WORKS

Royal Oaks Drive Traffic **Signal and Pedestrian Crossing** Improvements – The plans and specifications for the Royal Oaks Drive and Pedestrian Crossing Improvements have been prepared. Engineering is reviewing the plans and specifications along with funding sources which will include a portion (two-thirds) paid by the Duarte Unified School District.

PUBLIC SAFETY DEPARTMENT

New Sergeant - We are sad to announce that effective Sunday, September 3, Sergeant Dave Kearney was re-assigned as Temple Stations Operations Sergeant. Interviews were conducted with seven Sheriff Department Sergeants and we are pleased to announce that Sergeant Tony Osterman will be joining us as the new Duarte Liaison Sergeant. Sergeant Osterman has twenty years of service at Temple Station as both a deputy and as a sergeant combined.

Homeless Update – The City of Duarte is combining its efforts with the City of Irwindale to help resolve homeless issues in both

Together we are submitting a Measure H proposal for funding. The funds will be used to hire a consultant to create a Homeless Plan for both areas as well as weekly community outreach to the homeless by Union Station representatives.

Emergency Preparedness - The Duarte Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is officially operating. They have conducted monthly meetings and just held their first training exercise. Duarte CERT members will be receiving uniform shirts and traffic vests and they are scheduled to help with the Route 66 Parade and the City Picnic. We are still looking to recruit members who are already CERT trained.

This is the August 15, 2017 interpreter and how to plan effective outreach in intercultural settings, culturally competent individuals have a number of "soft skills" and perspectives that enable them to work effectively in these situations.

Craig Storti, the author of "Figuring Foreigners Out: A Practical Guide," summarized these in a list.1

Seven lessons to learn about cross-cultural communication

- 1. Don't assume sameness.
- 2. What you think of as normal behavior may only be cultural.
- 3. Familiar behaviors may have different
- 4. Don't assume that what you meant is what was understood.
- 5. Don't assume that what you understood is what was meant.
- 6. You don't have to like or accept different behaviors, but you should try to understand where they come from.
- 7. Most people do behave rationally, you just have to discover the rationale.

You can reduce mistakes and misunderstandings by becoming more familiar with your own assumptions, beliefs and values and the behaviors that accompany these. Increased awareness of the target audience's culture also

If you do make a mistake:

· Ask directly what you did

- Apologize if you think that it's appropriate.

Taking the Gold Line to Citrus College and beyond

This fall, over 20,000 students from throughout the San Gabriel Valley and beyond have taken the first step to changing their lives for the better by enrolling in courses at Citrus College.

For many, especially those who are low-income or first-generation college students, this is a momentous decision that comes with increased financial responsibilities, lifestyle changes and a great deal of hard work. A significant number of them have jobs and families that already place demands on their time and resources. For these students, transportation presents a major obstacle to achieving their higher education goals.

A recent survey conducted by the California Student Aid Commission found that the costs associated with attaining a college education, even for students attending one of California's affordable community colleges, can stack up quickly, and students can expect to pay up to \$1,000 per year on transportation alone.

Given its close proximity to the APU/Citrus College Gold Line Station—less than a block from the campus-Citrus College provides a unique higher education option for students seeking low-cost, convenient transportation. Perhaps that's the reason Citrus College students

have advocated for the Foothill Extension of the Gold Line for more than a decade. Even today, their commitment to public transportation remains strong. Last spring, 83 percent of them voted to increase their student fees so they could be part of the Class Pass program, which allows them to purchase low-cost transit passes for unlimited rides on Foothill Transit Local and Silver Streak bus lines.





A New Narrative for DUSD

Dr. Allan J. Mucerino, Superintendent, Duarte Unified School District

The Duarte Unified School District (DUSD) has completed the first leg of its transformative five year strategic plan known as the Competitive Advantage Plan (CAP). The CAP was the final product of an exhaustive evaluation of the school district. conducted in part by the Claremont Evaluation Center (CEC). The internationally renowned CEC collected data from over 4,500 stakeholders, including leaders of business and industry. The CEC conducted fifty focus group sessions to make sense of the survey data and provide the Board of Education with the information necessary to rewrite the prevailing narrative

The old narrative told the story of a proud district that had fallen on tough times in the recent past as a result of a multitude of internal and external factors that left the district under-enrolled and under-funded. The new narrative tells an entirely different story. DUSD is now a progressive school district drawing students from 83 cities throughout the region, state, and country.

The biggest draw is our newest addition, the California School of the Arts, the first replication of the nationally acclaimed Orange

County School of the Arts (OCSA) in Santa Ana. OCSA was established as part of an urban renewal effort in one of the poorest areas in Southern California. Families with school-age children were avoiding the area, worsening its economic issues. The public charter school drew families (and school employees) into the area, stimulated the local economy, and became the most prestigious visual and performing arts school in the country. Their success, over a 30-year history, led to their Board of Education's decision to replicate the model in other communities.

Their first project turned out to be in Duarte. The public charter is independent and operates with a compact between itself and DUSD to serve students in and out of Duarte. The school has brought 700 students into the community in its first year and is expected to bring in about 2,000 when fully mature. The school enhances the community and boosts the local economy.

In addition to CSArts, DUSD has also converted four of our elementary schools to K-8 academies, each with a unique focus and specialty:

- Andres Duarte Arts Academy is the only K-8 Artful Learning school in the entire nation and also incorporates Mindfulness.
- · Beardslee Academy is the site of the Spanish Dual Language Immersion program.
- Maxwell Academy is home of the International Baccalaureate Primary & Middle Years Programme.
- Royal Oaks STEAM Academy provides an integrated Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts & Mathematics program.

It's no wonder why Duarte Unified School District is now regarded as the most progressive and innovative destination school district in the region.



Engineer Your World (EYWTM) is a high school course offered in only 200 schools nation-wide and DHS is the only school providing this class in the San Gabriel Valley.

Developed with funding from the National Science Foundation by a team of University of Texas faculty and NASA engineers, EYWTM engages students in authentic engineering practices in a project-based environment. Students are expected to develop engineering design skills by building them along with the necessary habits of mind through exploration and discovery.

On September 1, the students in the Engineer Your World Class taught by Mr. Josh Johnson put their design skills to the test in the first project challenge of the school year. They were instructed to construct a self-propelled car that can travel a minimum distance of 2 feet. Teams had to use the same basic supplies that included cardboard and a rubber

The competition revved up with the added goal of out distancing the car designed by Mr. Johnson. The members of the winning team that constructed the car that traveled the farthest and beat Mr. Johnson's are: Eli Faliti, Joseph Duarte, Anthony Martinez and Alex Osuna.



The Cantabile Show Choir, Duarte High School's advanced choir ensemble, has been selected to participate in a Broadway Residency with Manhattan Concert Productions this coming February, 2018.

The students will venture to New York City to learn about the value of leadership and teamwork, and gain skills in live performance. The 5-day experience includes a 4-night stay at a midtown hotel, tickets to a Broadway show and the Top of the Rock Observation deck. Most importantly, they will have a chance to perform with professional Broadway actors and perform on stage at the iconic Carnegie Hall accompanied by the New York City Chamber Orchestra.

The Duarte Unified Choral Department has grown by leaps and bounds, and in the past couple of years four of the choirs have received a Superior Rating at festival, three students have won first place for both classical and pop vocal and instrumental solos, and the Show Choir has won six First Place titles and two High Musicianship awards.

Cantabile Show Choir is an auditioned group that, over the course of one week, learned a song in 4-part harmony, sang it in a choir, and by the end of the week, all students were singing their own parts in a quartet. This elite group was carefully interviewed and evaluated before acceptance and spent 40 hours in one week in Show Choir Boot Camp preparing for the new school year. They are looking forward to broadening their perspectives of the world through travel and gaining a better understanding of live performance by going to New York.

Solar Eclipse spurs S.T.E.M. excitement for students



A total solar eclipse crossed the entire country on Monday, August 21, for the first time since 1918.

Along with people across the continent, our students had the opportunity to view a partial look at an eclipse as the moon passed in front of the sun, casting a shadow on Earth's surface.

All of our schools engaged in special learning activities surrounding this phenomenon while taking precautions to ensure our students were able to safely experience this extraordinary celestial event.

It was a remarkable way to provide our students with a first-hand "look" into the wonders of astronomy while emphasizing the excitement of exploring Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics (STEM) that we hope many of our youth will seek as their own career choice in the future.

For that reason, at Duarte Unified, we are deliberately expanding the STEM opportunities afforded to our students beginning as early as Kindergarten. The Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) were adopted in California as well as nationally this past November.

As a school district committed to the Arts and Sciences, we got a jump on NGSS and began implementing Rigorous Course Design in science for Grades 7-12 two years ago, and piloted Project Lead the Way K-7 at Royal Oaks a year ago, to be replicated districtwide as soon as 2018-19.

Project Lead the Way engages students in hands-on activities, projects, and problems. It empowers students to solve real-world challenges and inspires them to reimagine how they see themselves and the world.

While California has adopted Common Core State Standards for mathematics, and we use the standards to guide our curricular and instructional program, we also apply what cognitive science has taught us about how the brain solves problems.

To that end, we use SWUN math for our younger students

with its dual-emphasis on performing accurate calculations and articulating math reasoning in order to achieve true mastery of the mathematical content.

Secondary-level students receive the integrated math curriculum.

Integrated I curriculum includes Algebra I and Geometry standards.

Integrated II adds additional standards in Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, and Probability/Statistics. Integrated III covers Geometry, Algebra II and Probability/Statistics concepts beyond I and II.

Whether students matriculate to Duarte High School or CSArts, the integrated program continues at both high schools.

Following the integrated curriculum series, students will be able to access higher math coursework at both high schools, such as AP Calculus and AP Statistics, in the same manner as they had before the Common Core State Standards in Mathematics were implemented. Making sense of mathematics education

and delivering a program that adds up to success for all is the goal.

Also provided to our students are the benefits of our singular partnership with the renowned City of Hope Medical Research Center located right here in Duarte.


Together, our faculty and City of Hope scientists have created authentic STEM learning programs ranging from hands-on genetic studies conducted by 2nd graders to on-site research internships afforded to high schoolers.

In addition, we have placed the power of technology into each of our students' hands through our 1:1 laptop program. Grades 6-12 are provided a computer to take back and forth from school to home, and students in grades K-5 have access to a computer each day when at school in their classrooms.

By the time the next total eclipse takes place in 2024, we imagine there will be several successful scientists, techies, engineers, and mathematicians reflecting on how it was a teacher at DUSD inspired them to reach for the stars when they viewed their first total eclipse 25 years before.
