**HOW CAN I DISPLAY THIS POSTER?** *Self-print:* You can print out the poster art document on an 8”x14” sized sheet of paper or poster board and display at the entry of your business. *Pre-printed Posters:* On/after May 21, Las Vegas area businesses may contact the Vegas Chamber to discuss printed posters that can be made available for pick-up. Reno/Sparks area businesses may contact the Reno+Sparks Chamber of Commerce to discuss printed posters that can be made available for pick-up.

**WHEN CAN I START DISPLAYING THIS POSTER?** This poster is being distributed to as many business and trade associations this week with the anticipation that Nevada businesses can begin displaying it upon receipt.

**AM I REQUIRED TO POST THIS IN MY PLACE OF BUSINESS?** It is encouraged by the state, but not required.

**ARE MY PATRONS REQUIRED TO WEAR A FACE COVERING?** Currently, it is encouraged by the state, but not required.

**BY WEARING FACE COVERINGS DOES THIS MEAN MY BUSINESS DOES NOT NEED TO COMPLY WITH OTHER STATE RECOMMENDATIONS?** It does not eliminate the need to practice social distancing, wash hands frequently, and avoiding touching of the face. It does not require employees to wear face coverings at work. Employee face covering requirements are established by the Governor. It does not require anyone to wear surgical masks or N-95 respirators. Surgical masks and respirators are critical supplies that should be reserved for health care workers, first responders, and others who need them.

**WHAT IS A FACE COVERING?** Currently, the State does not provide a definition for a face covering. The CDC defines cloth face coverings as fabric coverings including cloth face masks, scarves and bandana coverings, or any homemade face covering made of cotton fabric. The CDC also makes clear that cloth face coverings should: fit snugly but comfortably against the side of the face; be secured with ties or ear loops; include multiple layers of fabric; allow for breathing without restriction; and be able to be laundered and machine dried without damage or change to shape

**HOW DO FACE COVERINGS HELP PREVENT THE SPREAD OF COVID-19?** Facial coverings do not replace proper hygiene or social distancing, which the primary methods of protection. A cloth face covering does protect others and slow community spread of COVID-19 by blocking infectious droplets from spreading when someone with the infection speaks, coughs or sneezes. A key transmission method for the COVID-19 virus is through respiratory droplets, and growing evidence suggests that a significant number of infections are transmitted by asymptomatic people who are expelling those infectious droplets.

**IF I DON'T CURRENTLY HAVE FACE COVERINGS, WHERE DO I GET ONE?** Scarves and bandanas can serve as face coverings.
