A Conversation with your Police Department

The Irwindale Police Department is again pleased to have this opportunity to "dialogue" with you, our City's business residents. It's our hope that, through open communication, together we can address issues or concerns that you may have from time to time. This month:

Fraudulent State Inspectors-The cities of Lynwood and Duarte have both warned their business residents about individuals posing as state inspectors/employees. These individuals tend to prey upon small businesses (rather than, for example, larger or franchise chain companies). They have been known to fraudulently issue notices and collect money from these businesses.

A Lynwood Enforcement Officer advises: *I contacted three subjects who claimed they were enforcing the California Labor Laws. They were issuing notices and collecting money.*

subjective and ambiguous analysis, such as the classification of an individual as an employee versus an independent contractor.

Determining Status-Determining the status of a person as an independent contractor versus an employee is a daunting task for many businesses because of the subjective nature of the factors utilized in the analysis. Even state agencies admittedly do not agree on who qualifies as an independent contractor.

According to the California Department of Industrial Relations website: *“There is no set definition of the term ‘independent contractor’ for all purposes, and the issue of whether a worker is an employee or independent contractor depends upon the particular area of law to be applied. For example, in a wage claim where employment status is an issue, DLSE [Division of Labor Standards Enforcement] will often use the five-prong economic realities test to decide the issue. However, in a separate matter before a different state agency with the same parties and same facts, and employment status again being an issue, that agency may be required to use a different test, for example, the ‘control test,’ which may result in a different determination. Thus, it is possible that the same individual will be considered an employee for purposes of one law and an independent contractor under another.”*

SB 459-CalChamber believes that the “willful” definition included in SB 459 needs to clarify that it applies only to those employers that purposefully and/or specifically intend to misclassify an individual as an independent contractor in order to avoid the law.

Moreover, the sanctions imposed against an employer found to have “willfully” misclassified an individual under SB 459 are overzealous as the sanctions are not narrowly tailored to address the violation.

SB 459 requires an employer that has willfully misclassified an employee to:

1. post a notice on the employer’s website and/or any physical location in the state where it does business for one year;
2. have the notice signed by an officer of the company;
3. state in the notice that the employer has committed a serious violation of the law.

Although CalChamber believes there should be consequences for employers who specifically intend to violate the law, public humiliation that could jeopardize the employer’s future ability to continue business in California seems unnecessary.

Accordingly, CalChamber thinks the notice requirement should be limited in duration as well as disbursement, such as only to those individuals the employer seeks to classify as an independent contractor.

Action Needed-The CalChamber is calling on all employers to write Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. and urge him to veto SB 459.

reduced travel times to more state-of-the-art education facilities for our children, make for an ideal and immediate solution to our economic woes.

“And his plan to give aid to state and local governments couldn’t come at a better time for our state, given our dire budget situation. Our teachers, police officers, and firefighters need to be on the job and stay on the job to maintain a safe and economically viable California.”

As you can see in the photos (below), they are wearing the state logo on shirts with a fake state logo employee card. They are called the “California Labor Compliance Group.”

I checked with the Department of Industrial Relations Division of Labor Standards Enforcement (562) 983-1892 and was told that this organization is not authorized to enforce, collect money and use the state logo for any purpose.

I checked with Cal-Osha the Field Enforcement Bureau who said to let your police department know if you encounter these individuals.

Another unauthorized organization calls itself the “California Board of Regulations.” I was told by business owners that they wear the same color shirt with the State logo but the wording is different.

What You Can Do? - A legitimate inspector should not hesitate to offer you proper identification (business cards, etc) as well as telephone number(s) for their supervisors. They will not handle cash transactions or collect payment onsite.

You can independently verify any contact information for a State agency through the State of California website (www.ca.gov). Using that tool, you can also verify the inspector’s identity and purpose.

According to Cal/OSHA Division Chief Len Welsh: “It is important for all employers to know that a Cal/OSHA inspector will never request payment onsite, under any circumstance. Moreover, an inspector will never request payment in lieu of citations. We encourage all employers to ask for a state identification card and a business card. If the employer has suspicions that the individual is not a true Cal/OSHA representative, additional verification can be obtained by calling Cal/OSHA’s local office to ask about the individual.”

If you are approached by anyone claiming to be a State Inspector about whom you are suspicious or concerned, please do not



attempt to confront or detain him or her on your own - - call the Irwindale Police Department at (626) 430-2222.

Local Colleges and Businesses Honored for Environmental Effort

The Irwindale Chamber of Commerce Environmental Committee held its 4th annual Environmental Awards and Green Business Expo on Sept 1, 2011 at City of Hope in Duarte. This event made possible by presenting sponsor Veolia Environmental Services and community sponsors City of Hope, Foothill Transit, Vulcan Materials Company, and Waste Management was initiated to recognize businesses and organizations that have implemented and achieved reduction in their carbon footprint as related to environmental concerns. Recipients were chosen based on the information provided with the nomination form.



Citrus College received the 2011 Environmental Innovation Award for promoting sustainable textbook options for faculty choices among customized book modules, digital e-books, book rentals, donation of older editions, a la carte binders, reserve books, and open textbooks thus leading the field in its exploration of textbook alternatives.



California State Polytechnic University, Pomona received the 2011 Environmental Leadership Award for using reclaimed water to irrigate landscape and agricultural fields, for installing one megawatt of solar power (Producing 1,844,000 kWh annually), for aggressive recycling and composting programs across campus diverting 50% of waste from the landfill, for reducing emissions related to transportation and reducing gasoline consumption by 6000 gallons annually, and for installing a biodiesel tank using 10,000 gallons of bio fuel for their farm equipment, landscape vehicles, and the campus owned Bronco Express shuttle, and for new construction designed LEED Buildings.



Foothill Transit received the 2011 Energy Preservation Award for their continued commitment to the Ecoliner Electric Bus Project. The Ecoliner offers: Zero Emissions, Potential for 90% reduction in fuel costs, Lower maintenance costs, Ultra-quiet drive system, and 90% regenerative braking recapture. The Ecoliner leverages advanced lithium-ion battery quick-charge technology. Ecoliner buses reduce the demand for non-renewable sources of energy, reduce greenhouse gas emissions from

the transportation sector, and serve as an example for transit industries around the nation.



MillerCoors received the 2011 Water Conservation Award for implementing a sustainable landscape project at the Irwindale Brewery. The project included removing water hungry turf and replacing it with 87 drought resistant trees. In addition, the existing irrigation system was replaced with low flow and drip irrigation to minimize evaporation of the limited irrigation water needed for the replacement vegetation. As a result of this project, MillerCoors is saving 1.9 million gallons of the community's drinking water every month.

Honorable mention awards were also presented to **3M Unitek Corporation**, **Baldwin Park Unified School District**, **Picasso's Café, Bakery & Catering Company**, and **Vulcan Materials Company** for their meritorious contributions to environmental protection and resource conservation.

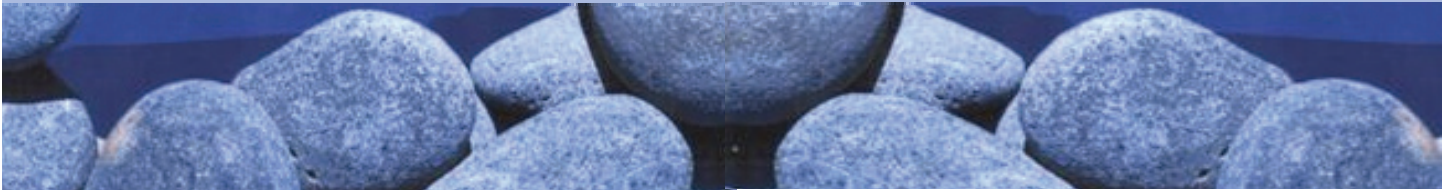

COUNCIL ROUND-UP – AUGUST 3 & 10, 2011

- Council approved a tolling agreement and dismissed without prejudice the lawsuit with USA Waste of California, Inc. and Irwindale Partners, L.P. concerning the backfill of the J.H. Pit.
- A resolution excusing Senior Citizen Commissioner David F. Martinez from meetings through July was approved by Council.
- Council waived formal bidding procedures and approved the issuance of a purchase order for the procurement of Motorola radio encryption kits and radio software for police department radios from Motorola Inc., a sole source vendor, per Irwindale Municipal Code section 3.44.080(c).
- Council rejected claims from Caro v. City of Irwindale and Juarez v. City of Irwindale and directed staff to send standard letters of rejection.
- Ordinance No. 653 to comply with the Voluntary Alternative Redevelopment Program pursuant to part 1.9 of division 24 of the California Health and Safety Code to permit the continued existence and operation of the Irwindale Community Redevelopment Agency was introduced for first reading by Council.
- Council adopted Resolution no. 2011-41-2527, which replaced resolution no. 2011-05-2491, establishing the number of positions, schedule of classes and compensation for city employees

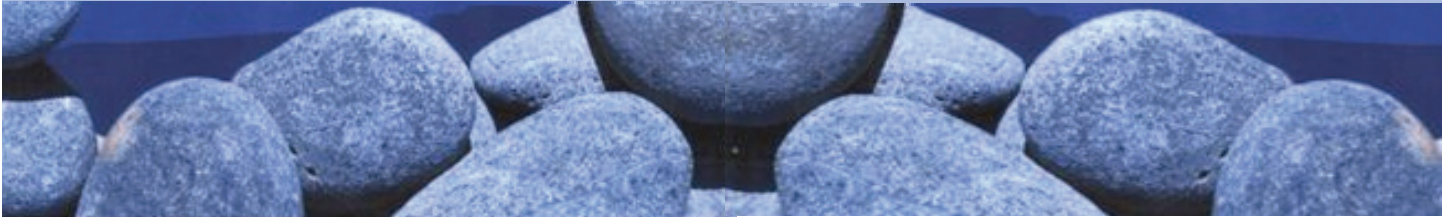

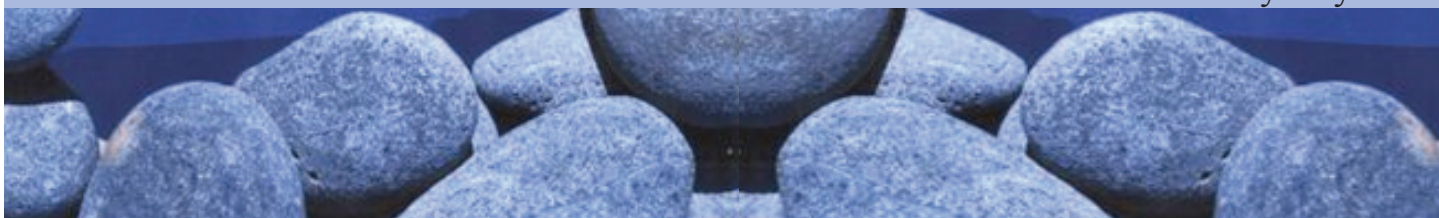

State Law Does Not Require Employers to Give Reason for Termination

We are terminating a problem employee today. Do we have to give him/her a reason?

The simple answer: No. California law does not require that you give an employee a reason why he/she is being terminated; it is part of the “at-will” policy in California.

Indeed, the “Notice to Employee as to Change in Relationship” that is required by the Employment Development Department does not have a mandatory section for an employer to note why it is terminating an employee.

If you do give a reason, however, it is imperative that it is the truth and the real reason. If your termination is challenged (i.e., a wrongful termination lawsuit), you don’t want to be “back pedaling” and changing your story.

Termination Approaches: There are different schools of thought as to how to handle a termination. Many employers prefer to simply tell the employee, “This isn’t working out,” and not enter into an elaborate discussion with the individual.

Other employers prefer to explain to the person the reason behind the termination. There is no right or wrong way to handle this situation-it may depend on the person being terminated. Some individuals want to argue the decision, and that is probably when it’s best to stay simple and explain it

isn’t a topic for a discussion, but it is a decision that has been made. Other individuals may benefit from a simple discussion of why they are being let go and accept it as closure.

It’s also best not to call a termination a “layoff” when it’s truly a termination. If the position is filled relatively quickly, the ex-employee might find out and claim the layoff was a subterfuge and the termination was discriminatory in nature.

Disciplinary Warnings: If an employer follows the progressive disciplinary path, most employees will know why they are being let go. If they receive oral warnings, followed by written warnings, and possibly even a suspension, there will be ample evidence supporting the decision to terminate in the event the decision is challenged.

A stated policy of progressive discipline tends to erode into the at-will relationship, since the courts have held that a promise of progressive discipline guarantees the employee ample warnings before termination. However, the practice of progressive discipline supports the employer.

If a termination of employment is a difficult decision to make, it is always wise to consult an employment law attorney to guide you through the process.
