# Mozart Masterpiece at King Center in Melbourne <br> Brevard Community Chorus presents celebrated Requiem May 6 

(MELBOURNE, FL) April 24, 2017 -- Dr. Robert E. Lamb, Professor of Music, Director of Choral Activities, and member of the Department of Performing and Visual Arts for Eastern Florida State College will conduct the Brevard Community Chorus in a spring performance of the Mozart Requiem Mass in D minor on Saturday, May 6th, at 7:30 p.m. on the main stage of the King Center for the Performing Arts at 3865 N. Wickham Road in Melbourne, 32935. Accompanied by select players from the Brevard Symphony Orchestra, the 125 member chorus will include singers from the Eastern Florida State College Concert Choir. They will be joined by four professional soloists: Rebecca Holbrook-Loar, soprano; Eliza Dopira, mezzo-soprano; Kyle Jones, tenor and Thomas Potter, bass. Written in 1791, the celebrated requiem mass and its illustrious composer were dramatized in the Academy Award-winning 1984 film, Amadeus. General admission tickets are $\$ 20$ for adults, $\$ 15$ for seniors and active military and $\$ 5$ for children or college students with valid student identification.
