




"The Mission of The Virgin Valley Heritage Museum is to deepen the understanding of the community and visitors about the Virgin Valley, specifically Mesquite, Bunkerville and Southern Nevada. We strive to bring history to life through collections, exhibits, special events, and educational opportunities. We also strive to preserve and protect our local history."

–Mission Statement, Virgin Valley Heritage Museum

The building that houses the Virgin Valley Heritage Museum was built



in 1941. The original purpose of the building was to serve the community as a library and museum. The building served as the Mesquite branch of the Clark County Library for about a year. The building was then converted to and used as a hospital. With the \$35 donation from each family in town, Dr. Gilbert and Bertha Howe, a registered nurse, went to Las Vegas and bought the medical supplies necessary to open the hospital. The library building was then converted and used as the hospital and only medical facility in town until 1977. After being closed for a few years, it was used as a Boy Scout meeting

hall. In 1984, the newly incorporated City of Mesquite reclaimed it and designated it a museum to house the historical treasures of the Virgin Valley. On January 6th 1877 Edward Bunker Sr.'s company arrived in what would become Bunkerville. Construction on the Dam and Irrigation canals began and the pioneers went to work on making the area their home. As the town grew the settlers looked to expand and turned their eyes across the river to the area known as Mesquite Flats. They say that the third time is a charm. That's just the way it was for the proud families who fought to create a life for themselves in Mesquite Flats. Between 1878



and 1882 fifteen families and a total of seventy-one people had moved to Mesquite and were successfully farming the area. The lifeblood of this high desert community was the Virgin River. However, a heavy rainstorm at any time of the year can turn the Virgin River into a raging torrent. Those first settlers found this out in June of 1882 when six miles of irrigation canals were broken in fifty different places by torrents of the afternoon thunderstorms. For a community dependent on this canal, it was a devastating loss. Work began immediately to repair the damage but it was not long until the river had forced everyone out. In 1887, Dudley Leavitt with his wives and children tried to settle Mesquite Flats again. After a four-year struggle against the elements they too were forced to leave. Finally, in 1894, hearty pioneers attempted a third time to tame



Mesquite Flats. Six young families from Bunkerville rebuilt the canal and established themselves permanently along the bank of the Virgin River. In 1898, the town changed its name from Mesquite Flats to Mesquite. Farming has taken place in Mesquite for over 100 years. Success of agricultural development in Mesquite is the result of the Virgin River and the innovative irrigation system created by the early settlers to water their crops. In 1894 many crops were planted in Mesquite. These crops were cotton, grapes, alfalfa, wheat and sugar cane. Also pomegranates and figs were planted and produced very well. For a time, cotton and raisins were the main cash crops in the community.

For much of the late 20th century dairies dominated the landscape. At one time there were five dairies in Mesquite. As the automobile grew in popularity Mesquite entrepreneurs opened motels and campgrounds for travelers and tourists. Tourists increased the demand for agricultural products, such as milk and eggs, and surpluses soon made their way to markets in Las Vegas.

Just like Mesquite has changed with the times so has the Museum; we have branched out into the online world. The Museum catalog is available online at mesquitenv. pastperfect-online.com. We also have an active facebook page where we are able to interact and share the history of the Valley all over the world; you can find us at www.facebook. com/MesquiteNVMuseum. We invite you to visit the Virgin Valley Heritage Museum to experience a taste of the rich pioneer heritage that makes up this great area.

#### **HOW DO I KNOW WHAT IS TAXABLE?**

Nearly all tangible personal property transferred for value is taxable. This includes property purchased for lease or rent. Most goods, wares, and merchandise are taxable in Nevada. Services associated with the sale of tangible personal property may also be taxable. Only installation and repair/reconditioning service is not taxable if it is separately stated on the invoice. Most food purchases of unprepared or uncooked food is not taxable. You may write to the Department of Taxation at any of the District offices about the taxability of a specific item.

#### **ARE DELIVERY CHARGES TAXABLE?**

Any charges for freight, transportation or delivery in connection with the sale of tangible personal property that are separately stated on a customer invoice are NOT taxable pursuant to AB403. (Effective 05/22/09) If they are not separately stated they are taxable. Handling, packaging, and crating are still taxable even if separately stated. Prior to 05/22/09 charges for freight, transportation or delivery in connection with the sale of tangible personal property was taxable.

## **GREATER MESQUITE ARTS FOUNDATION**

When asked about the local arts scene in Mesquite, Nevada, residents respond enthusiastically and across the board. "Sure! We've got painters. Dancers too." Another adds "drawing class." A few mention the theatre. All are correct...mostly. There is a vibrant and growing Arts Community here, and the Greater Mesquite Arts Foundation (GMAF) is an integral part of the whole.

In 2007, a group of likeminded citizens came together and established GMAF, a registered notfor-profit corporation in Nevada. In its capacity as a 501(c)(3), GMAC proudly advocates for and helps fund the nonprofit arts organizations in the area. In addition to providing much needed venues, the all-volunteer membership serves as the Board of Directors, maintains an office, hosts a monthly Round Table, seeks grants and raises funds, and provides community outreach and education. In the spring of 2014, \$10,000 was distributed among the 5 associate organizations.

Early collaboration with the Nevada Arts Council (NAC) helped establish GMAF as a liaison for rural area grants. These monies helped fund the first Mesquite Arts Festival & Fair. Additional grants enabled the Virgin Valley Artists Association to begin their Get Smart and Stay Smart programs working with young children and seniors. Basic grant writing classes were held for the groups, and with their success came funds. The City of Mesquite recognized GMAF as a large grant recipient that could distribute the monies within the local Arts organizations. Despite economic challenges and dwindling resources, the grant seeking, fund raising, communication and coordination within the Art Community and NAC remains constant and strong.

Education is a cornerstone for GMAF and its purpose to enhance public awareness of and support for the arts; and to promote the arts and culture in and around the city of



Mesquite. The GMAF membership is actively involved with publicizing and expanding community awareness of their partner organizations.

The **Mesquite Arts Council** (MAC) acts as a booking agent to identify and bring outside attractions to this area. They have presented BYU music and dance, the Missoula Childrens' Theater, individual artists, and statewide poetry groups. Their efforts enlighten and benefit gradeschoolers to grandparents. An annual Holiday Festival of Trees provides local artists and groups a stage for their skills as well as a fundraising opportunity.

The Virgin Valley Artists Association (VVAA) operates the Mesquite Fine Arts Gallery and Classroom on Mesquite Blvd. Monthly exhibitions have expanded to include state and national - as well as local - talent. Paintings in many mediums, jewelry, pottery, sculpture, fabric, and 'clever ideas' are offered The Gallery showcases this daily. individual excellence and expression in frequently changing displays. Also offered are art and pottery classes. Within the Gallery are lectures,

receptions and fundraisers. Volunteer members warmly welcome everyone to "spend some time and perhaps find a gift."

The Mesquite Toes Tap Team (MTTT) may well be the 'most active seniors' in all of Nevada! For 11 years these women have voluntarily spent hours learning and practicing tap dance routines and raising Their well-choreographed money. performances regularly sell out to loyal fans, and new shows are greeted enthusiastically. They accept invitations and travel both near and far: California, New York City, World Cruise Lines, and Branson, MO are all on the itinerary this year. While the average age bounces around the mid 70s, the Mesquite Toes continually exhibit skill, vigor and vitality. They are living proof that healthy exercise leads to a lot of fun living!

The **Virgin Valley Theater Group** (VVTG) has a myriad of characters comprising their cast of performers. Volunteer members also provide support backstage, help build and break down sets, make/alter costumes, and create publicity. All rehearse! This talented group successfully



presents recognized comedies, dramas and musicals each year. Their 'seasonal' audience is growing in both appreciation and sophistication. New this summer is a "Fly Willie" Actors Workshop in developmental theatre. Classes and rehearsals will hopefully culminate in a spring performance. Another newborn is the Shakespeare Workshop, a study to help 'demystify, The Bard.' Performances are held in the Mesquite Community Theatre on Yucca St.

Senior The Ms. Mesquite Pageant (MSMP) also builds stage and confidence for presence everyone involved. Adapting to life as a retired senior presents challenges for many. MSMP volunteers enjoy their peers rediscover helping unused talents, develop public poise and become involved with the arts. Interested women of 60 and more are invited into coaching, competition, camaraderie and community action. MSMP is the first local step before statewide and national contests. For many contestants their Pageant has opened new doors to a more vital retirement in Mesquite.

In addition to enhancing the awareness and support of these 5 arts organizations, the Greater Mesquite Arts Foundation is bound to provide venues for the display of the creative talents of performers, artists and crafters. The City and GMAF partnered in a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), for the management of the theatre in the old school complex on Yucca St. With City redevelopment funds, some professional and determined volunteer help, the old cafeteria was transformed into a 200 seat theatre! The opening performance of 'Cowgirls' was on March 6, 2009. The Mesquite Community Theatre committee, MCT is responsible for the daily operations, many ongoing equipment improvements, scheduling and growth. Their valuable Theatre Guild staffs and runs the Box Office, 5 satellite locations, the Ushers and snack bar. The theatre is dark only in the hottest part of the summer.

The Board and volunteers of GMAF continue to be an advocate voice for the arts community in all weather, 365 days a year. They make City Council announcements, publish quarterly calendars, and encourage increased theatre use. The heart of advocacy is done face to face. The arts are for everyone, in some way. Conversation, attendance, invitations to the theatre, and constant support of all the organizations' activities is a way of serving, a way of increasing awareness.

Advocacy and support also embrace those just coming to the Arts Community. GMAF has recently embraced two new groups as Committees within GMAF. The Mesquite Showgirls are an active volunteer group aiding businesses organizations as cheerful, and colorful greeters, ushers, ticket sellers. Their vivacious, outgoing energy is welcomed in Mesquite. Also new to GMAF is the newly formed Southern Nevada Symphonic Orchestra which will debut November 22, 2014 in the Mesquite Community Theatre. This volunteer group, spearheaded by Dr. and Mrs. Selmer Spitzer, will provide a much needed musical sphere in the arts community. The glorious sound of orchestral music is welcomed to Mesquite.

At the end of the performance, the bills must be paid. Unquestionably, art needs to be seen to be appreciated, to grow. In order to support the arts community, GMAF actively seeks grant monies, bequests and donations. They also present an annual Hearts for the Arts Gala in February. Featuring silent and live auctions, entertainment and excellent food, this event is a dress up, sit down, served dinner Special Night Out. Following this months-long effort, all available funds for the year are shared among the nonprofit Arts Community.

The \$10,000 distributed this past year reached an Arts Community that is an integral part of the Mesquite Community. Art may be one persons view of everyday beauty brought to your attention. It may be hearing a song echoed in your own heart. Art, in lesson form or seen as a play, may inspire you to discover an exciting new facet to yourself. The money, hard earned by people like yourself, is spent primarily to introduce you to the gifts and pleasures of the arts. You are cordially invited to spend some of your time exploring the arts in Greater Mesquite.

## **CLOSE TO NATURE**



#### Grand Canyon-Parashant National Monument

Grand Canyon - Parashant's natural splendor provides a sense of solitude to those who venture into its isolated domain. Located on the edge of one of the most beautiful places on earth, the Grand Canyon, the Monument extends over a million acres north of the Canyon to the Nevada border.

Rising in two great stair steps from the Mojave Desert, the dramatic Grand Wash Cliffs create the rugged spine of the Grand Canyon-Parashant. These dramatic cliffs mark the intersection between four distinct ecological communities the Sonoran and Mojave deserts and the Great Basin and Colorado Plateau. The resulting diverse ecosystem, ranging from stark, arid desert to lush, high plateaus, creates a unique habitat for wildlife. Deep, intricate canyons, jagged mountains, frozen lava flows and lonely buttes await visitors and offer testimony to the earth's geologic record. Relatively undisturbed Paleozoic and Mesozoic sedimentary rock layers, rich in fossils, offer a clear glimpse of the region's geologic history.

The Monument should be visited with careful planning and respect. This land is vast and wild and there are no services available.

#### Valley of Fire State Park

Between Mesquite and Las Vegas (approx. 40 miles) lies the Valley of Fire State Park. This 26,000-acre desert is Nevada's oldest state park. The sevenmile drive through the park offers the opportunity for exploring ancient Indian petroglyphs, photographing brilliant red rock formations, spotting the speedy roadrunner and getting a glimpse of a rare kit fox or spotted skunk.

#### Zion National Park

Zion National Park, in Utah, was established in 1919. It has massive, 2,000-foot high cliffs, separated by narrow hiking trails and riverbeds. The six-mile road through Zion treats visitors to amazing stone formations and red cliffs with majestic names such as Angels Landing, Great White Throne and the Three Patriarchs. The park is open year round and dons a new set of colors for each of the four seasons.


The park may be toured by vehicle, bicycle or tram. Horseback rides are available. Hiking trails are available and three are accessible by wheelchair, as are some of the camping areas.

#### Lake Mead Recreational Area

Lake Mead National Recreation Area (NRA) offers a wealth of things to do and places to go year-round. Its huge lakes cater to boaters, swimmers, sunbathers, and fishermen while its desert rewards hikers, wildlife photographers, and roadside sightseers.

#### Bryce Canyon National Park

Bryce Canyon National Park, further north and east of Utah's Zion Park, is home to 56 square miles of colorful limestone spires. The park is open year round and offers hiking, horseback riding, camping, ranger-led hikes, geology talks and cross-country skiing. Snow is common from November through March and provides an opportunity to enjoy cross-country skiing and snowshoeing.

#### Gold Butte: Nevada's piece of the Grand Canyon

South of Mesquite where the Virgin River meanders past the mountains into Lake Mead and down to the Colorado River, lies an area known as Gold Butte—Nevada's "piece of the Grand Canyon." Gold Butte is so-called because of the area's wide-open views of lands from Lake Mead all the way to the Grand

Wash Cliffs in the Grand Canyon-Parashant National Monument across the border in Arizona. Gold Butte entices the adventurous with names like Rattlesnake Peak, Hell's Kitchen and Paradise Valley. The area boasts 550 square miles for exploration, photography, nature study, and a tranquility only wilderness can provide.

Gold Butte is recognized as an Area of Critical Environmental Concern for the threatened desert tortoise and other Mojave Desert



wildlife, such as bighorn sheep, Gila monsters and burrowing owls. The best time to view wildlife is at sunset and sunrise, especially during the spring and fall seasons.

What you will also find in Gold Butte is an experience of the old West: ranching and mining history, past signs of Native American cultures and landscape vistas unbroken by powerlines or other development. You will not find restrooms, water or visitor information.

Recreation opportunities abound

in this rugged backcountry! Gold Butte has over 500 miles of designated roads and ATV trails, and includes the Gold Butte Back County Byway. The Byway is a 60 mile loop; the first 20 miles is paved, the next 20 miles is graded and the last 20 miles is highclearance 4x4 recommended. Be sure to bring your camera, the photography vistas and scenery are incredible in this part of the country. Maps and information are available

at www.blm.gov or www. friendsofgoldbutte.org.

Presently there are no designated hiking trails in Gold Butte. Although, the ATV trails may be used for hiking, biking and trail running. Opportunity for cross-country hiking is endless; incorporate a spring in your destination to include wildlife and bird watching. In the fall, the southern portion of Gold Butte offers excellent upland game bird hunting.

### The off-road riding season is officially here

With temperatures finally out of triple digits, you might be asking yourself what is there to do when I am not playing golf. Let me clue you in on some of the gems you are missing if you are not on an ATV.

First is the camaraderie, it's all about spending quality time with friends and family in the great outdoors. The world is a complicated and hectic

place and when we are out on the trail those things don't matter.

Second, is the spiritual connection. Most of us feel more alive when we are immersed in the great outdoors. The smell of sage or wildflowers or watching one of our amazing sunsets



really makes you feel real.

Third, the exploration. If you want a modern day treasure hunt then try geocaching. There are literally hundreds of hidden caches within a 50 mile proximity to Mesquite. If you are wondering what geocaching is all about, then you're not alone. Geocaching involves looking up gps coordinates that can be found at www.geocaching. com. Once you have located some near Mesquite then it's time to go find them. All you need is a handheld gps, plug in the coordinates and go find the cache. Many of the caches are only accessible by an ATV.

If you don't know where to ride there is a couple of ATV riding clubs that hardly cost anything to join and yet offer organized rides several times a month. St. George Bureau

of Land Management (BLM) office on River Road, have several detailed maps that can keep you from getting stranded, as well as showing you designated off road routes.


This program would be absolutely impossible without the community support that it receives every year, and it just keeps getting better and better. Thank you to all that get involved and lend support!




