Who We Are

Catholic Family Services, established in 1955, is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) mental healthcare provider that serves more than 7,000 St. Louis-area residents each year. We operate six offices that are spread through four area counties, and we also provide onsite student counseling at more than 100 metro-area schools.

Who We Serve

We provide our services to all, irrespective of religion, age, race, gender, or marital status. About 40 percent of our clients are children. We offer sliding-scale fees to clients who cannot afford full rates or who do not have insurance coverage. Our services include individual, group, and family counseling, psychiatric care, and parenting classes. In addition, we operate the Fatherhood Initiative Program, which guides low-income men in becoming better fathers to their children, and the Language Access Metro Project (LAMP), which provides 24/7 interpretation assistance for non-English speakers in instances in which thorough comprehension is crucial, such as when receiving medical care or legal assistance.

Catholic Family Services is deeply grateful for the work of its volunteers and would very much welcome other area residents who would like to donate their time to our mission.

The Child Center, Inc is a not-for-profit 501 (c) (3) child advocacy agency. Our mission statement is: Responding to child abuse through a supportive team approach to reduce the trauma to children and their non-offending family members. Healing - Helping - Hope

Who We Serve

Specialized services of the Center include providing a safe, non threatening environment to interview children after allegations of sexual abuse and serious physical abuse have been made, AND, it reduces multiple interviews of children by multiple interviewers. The services support children and families through the entire process of abuse recovery by providing crisis intervention, mental health therapy, medical exams, victim advocacy, court advocacy, referrals services, victim compensation assistance and a multidisciplinary team approach designed to reduce trauma during the investigation process.

In addition, the Center conducts abuse prevention programs for children at schools, educational seminars for parents, and workshops/trainings for professionals.

The Child Center, Inc has expanded its service area to include the fourteen (14) counties of St. Charles, Lincoln, Warren, Montgomery, Pike, Ralls, Marion, Monroe, Shelby, Lewis, Clark, Knox, Scotland and Schuyler.

Volunteer Opportunities

The Child Center, Inc. believes that volunteers are necessary to achieve its mission and increase awareness in our communities. We have several opportunities for volunteers from assisting with current and future campaigns, to undertaking third party fundraisers or working at our Fall Festival.

Who We Are

Seeking to put God's love into action, Habitat for Humanity brings people together to build homes, communities and hope. Habitat for Humanity of St. Charles County is a non-profit ecumenical Christian housing ministry dedicated to constructing decent, affordable homes with hard-working, low-income families. We are both the builder and the "bank" for our families, as they would not qualify for a traditional bank loan. Through our partnership our families help build and then buy their homes, which allow Habitat to continue to fund future building. We offer a hand up, not a hand out. Since our inception in 1997, we have built 55 homes in partnership with qualifying St. Charles County families of diverse backgrounds.

Who We Serve

HFHSCC serves families who meet the following criteria:

1. **Need:** Families who are unable to obtain adequate housing through conventional means and have a present substandard housing issue such as problems with structure, electricity, plumbing, handicap accessibility, etc., no permanent housing or current housing is overcrowded or unaffordable.
2. **Ability to Pay:** Families must be within 30-60% of the median income in St. Charles County and be able to pay a 30 year, interest free mortgage.
3. **Willingness to Partner:** All families selected for the program will perform 350 sweat equity hours for HFHSCC through the building of their home. Homeownership training classes are also required.
4. **Resident:** Families must currently live in St. Charles County and have lived here for the past year.

Volunteer Opportunities

Habitat for Humanity simply could not exist without our volunteers! They are the heart of our organization. With more than 2,500 volunteers, Habitat for Humanity of St. Charles County brings together individuals and groups from faith institutions, corporations, educational, and community groups to work to ensure that all families have a simple, decent, affordable home. Some opportunities include our construction site to help build the home, be a site greeter for our volunteers, providing lunch on Saturdays, work in our ReStore or clerical work in our office.

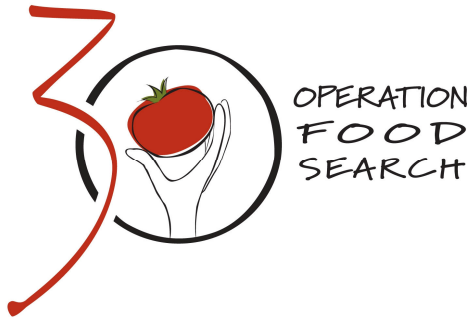
- Intellectual stimulation through lifelong learning

Who We Are

Operation Food Search, founded in 1981, is the largest distributor of free food in the St. Louis bi-state region. With a network of 265 agencies (food pantries, shelters and soup kitchens) over 120,000 people are provided food assistance each month. Almost half of those served, are children. Our service area includes 15 counties in Missouri and 15 counties in Illinois. Operation Food Search operates from a main distribution center located in University City and a second distribution center located in O'Fallon, Missouri.

Who We Serve

As a leader in the fight against hunger, Operation Food Search's mission goes above and beyond basic food collection and distribution. In addition to providing food and other supplies to our network of agencies, Operation Food Search has nutrition education programs and cooking classes, a 24/7 hunger hotline and our child-focused *Operation Backpack* program. Operation Backpack provides a backpack of food to children who may be at risk of hunger. Currently over 2,500 children in St. Louis and St. Charles County receive a backpack each week.

Volunteer Opportunities

Volunteers are essential to the success of Operation Food Search, and donating time is a great way to help feed the hungry in our communities. We have opportunities to help in the warehouse and at different events throughout the year. We also are seeking dietitians and chefs that would be interested in teaching in our nutritional education and cooking programs.

Consider becoming a monetary donor. For every \$1.00 donated, Operation Food Search is able to distribute \$17 worth of nourishing food to hungry families. We also encourage you to conduct a food drive at your work, school or neighborhood. We make it easy by delivering collection barrels and posters at the start of your food drive and picking up the donation after the food drive has ended. We also have "Virtual Food Drive" which is an easy and fun way to have a food drive where anyone can donate food by purchasing items on a personal website that is set up specifically for your drive.

Who We Are

Our Lady's Inn is an emergency residential agency serving pregnant women and their children since 1982. The mission of Our Lady's Inn is rebuilding lives, one mother, one baby, one family at a time. Our Lady's Inn has two locations, one in South City, 4223 S. Compton and the St. Charles location opening in 2006.

Who We Serve

Our Lady's Inn provides a loving home and an array of services supporting pregnant moms and their children dealing with homelessness. Since 1982, Our Lady's Inn has served as a life affirming maternity home for more than 5,000 women. For more than 30 years these families have been sheltered and supported in efforts to live healthy and productive lives, attain goals, gain employment, education, and secure stable housing. The moms staying at Our Lady's Inn are required to be working or going to school and attending life skills classes every evening. In St. Charles, the families can stay for up to one year. Included in the services is an extensive aftercare program, giving support to families for two years after they move from Our Lady's Inn.

Volunteer Opportunities

Our Lady's Inn has many volunteer opportunities. There are needs to help in the office, cook meals, help play with children, hold babies, present classes, yard and house maintenance and serving on the Friends Committee to help with fundraisers. Our Lady's Inn welcomes families to serve together and other church groups and community groups.

Donations

Our Lady's Inn participates in the Maternity Home Tax Credits which allows the donor to claim a state income tax credit equal to fifty percent of a donation over \$100. This credit is in addition to the regular state and federal deductions claimed for charitable donations. There is also a need for household supplies and other items listed on the website.

Sts. Joachim and Ann Care Service mission is to serve those in crisis and prevent homelessness and hunger. The Care Service helps vulnerable or homeless children and adults in the Tri-County area with housing, food, and employment services, in addition to other crisis intervention services. We are a 97% volunteer agency.

Volunteer Opportunities

There are many opportunities to volunteer at the Care Service. The following jobs are where we typically need help. **Caseworkers** work one day a week from 10:00am - 3:00pm. The Caseworkers certify recipients with a sit down interview and enter the collected information into the computer. They work with our neighboring St. Vincent de Pauls and other churches and agencies to help those in need in St. Charles, Lincoln and Warren Counties. No experience is necessary. We provide training for the skills needed, but it is helpful to have some familiarity with the computer and a desire to help those in need. **Pantry Drivers** make food pick ups at grocery stores and drop off at the Care Service for unloading and sorting. Our **Pantry Workers** sort the food and prepare for and/or work our pantry night when they hand out food to the recipients. We use **Maintenance** volunteers to help with our large facility for the occasional moving of furniture, meeting set ups, heating and cooling maintenance and minor repairs. We have **fundraisers and special events** that can always use help. We also have **Data Entry, Clerical, and Phone Work** needs with our Programs, Development, Information Systems, and Administration areas.
