

ALBERT "AL" KEEFER Class of 1948

During Al's time at Ottawa High School, he participated in football (3), basketball and track (2), Junior class officer, Junior class play (lead role), and sports editor of newspaper and yearbook. Before beginning his advanced educational journey, Al served with the USA 40th Infantry Division in the Korean War. Upon returning to his hometown, he entered the field of education. Al was an educator in Ottawa for 38 years. He began teaching in 1957 at Lincoln Elementary for 3 years, followed by 9 years at Garfield Elementary beginning in 1960. In 1969, he became Eisenhower Elementary School's first principal until he retired in 1995. Upon retirement, Al still made time for children by tutoring and providing mentoring at Eisenhower and Garfield. Staff remember him basing his decisions on this statement, "What is best for our students?" and for his favorite phrase, "I understand".
