Many visitors to the store at the grand opening thought the store, which is located at 60615 U.S. 285 in downtown Bailey, looked great.

Mastroianni said that the boutique is really just to support the Mountain Peace Shelter and the families who need help in the community. The boutique is an important fundraiser because different grants are getting reduced and the shelter needs a steady income and needs to diversify the funding sources.

Three people are needed in the store every day. People interested in volunteering can call Laurie Rogers,

The boutique is accepting items that are clean and in good, working condition, free of stains and tears, according to information posted by Mastroianni on Pinecam (www.pinecam.com) in the Mountain Peace Shelter forum under Agencies. Items accepted include clothing and accessories, household items, recreational items, furniture and antiques, electronics and media items, and pet items. The boutique will not accept TVs, computers, keyboards, large appliances, construction materials, mattresses and used bed pillows, children's car seats, or any broken or unsellable items. Currently, the store is open Tuesdays through Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., but those hours might get trimmed down a bit because of lack of volunteer coverage, Mastroianni said.

BUSINESS OF THE MONTH

The Park County Republican and Fairplay Flume at 5138 Park County Road 64, P.O. Box 460, Bailey, CO 80421 is published every Friday and is the official newspaper in Park County, Colorado.

The Flume, established in 1879, is almost as old as the county it serves - Park County, Colorado, which was formed in 1861. Park County lies just west of Jefferson County, the westernmost and most mountainous of the seven counties that are typically used in defining metro Denver. Headquartered in Bailey, an unincorporated town in the northeastern part of the county, The Flume covers all areas of life in Park County, including business, politics, the courts, weather, crime, festivals, fires and more. At the core of the stories in The Flume are the residents themselves, now numbering more than 16,000 in a county that's 83 percent bigger than Rhode Island and nearly as big as Delaware.

The Flume is also the newspaper that carries legal notices for Park County and advertisements focusing on area businesses.

While stories focus mainly on Park County, coverage can extend beyond county boundaries because of strong ties of residents to work, shopping and recreational opportunities in nearby counties.

Population centers include the following: Alma - 10,350 feet above sea level, it's an old mining town that is now a bedroom community for several Summit County ski resorts. It is about 16 miles south of Breckenridge. It is one of two incorporated towns in Park County, the other being Fairplay.
