KENOSHA CAFÉ at 50544 US Hwy 285, Grant Co 80448 is owned by Loftin, Mike Janner, and Scott Dugan. Dugan also owns the Tumbling River Ranch, where Loftin is the executive chef. Loftin said he and Janner are classically trained chefs.

The breakfast menu includes the best biscuits and gravy in Colorado, he said, as well as breakfast burritos, baked goods and pastries. Everything is made from scratch; nothing's brought in from the store, he said. Loftin also uses local quality ingredients, including beef and farm fresh eggs.

The lunch menu will include traditional items, like sandwiches and burgers. It also includes some gluten free options and vegetarian items.

A customer in the café was overheard saying it's

nice to have a restaurant in the middle of nowhere. Loftin said he wants the café to be the place in the middle of nowhere with amazing food.

Jerry Humphrey, vice president with the chamber, said it's great that another business has opened in the area.

There is space available for meetings, said Loftin. There are two front porches with tables, and outdoor seating will be available. There are also plans to build a patio off to the side of the building.

When the ranch opens in the summer, Loftin will be working there full time and will need some local help through the summer at the café. He will return to the café when the ranch closes in September.

The Importance of water
especially as summer approaches

Water is great for other reasons. In April of 2002, researchers at Loma Linda University found that people who drank five 8-ounce glasses of water daily were about half as likely to die of coronary heart disease as those who drank two glasses of water or less.

A few correlational studies have shown that individuals who consume 8 cups of water per day are less likely to suffer from:

colon cancer, urinary tract cancer, urinary stone disease, salivary gland disorders, childhood and adolescent obesity

Water carries many other benefits:

Drinking plenty of water may help relieve headaches. Some of the most common headaches are due to dehydration. This may contribute to altitude sickness as well. Proper hydration will help

keep your joints and muscle lubricated so you're less likely to cramp or sprain.

Drinking water improves the vitality of your skin. You will look younger if your skin is healthier.

Drinking water regulates your body temperature and helps fuel your muscles.

Water also helps flush out the toxins and waste products from your body.

Without water, your heart will have to work harder to pump oxygenated blood to all cells, and so will the rest of your vital organs, which can cause fatigue. Drinking water will relieve fatigue of this kind.
