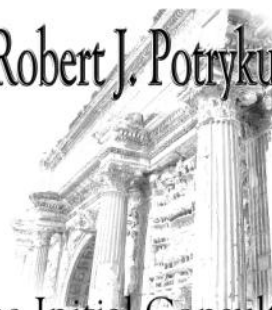

I Love U Guys and Emily's Parade

Over 3,000 people honored and celebrated Emily Keyes, other victims of school violence and First Responders at the 5th Annual Emily's Parade and ER:5k Walk & Run on September 26th.

The beautifully warm Sunday was perfect for the activities and brought out more folks than expected. What a great turnout! Even the amount of onlookers that waved the riders on from the side of the road was more than usual.

Over 100 people registered for the ER:5k, though many more joined in. (I always get choked up when I see the Jeffco SWAT team coming in with their flag held high.)

Our volunteer count between Columbine & Platte Canyon was close to 350! That's pretty remarkable!

An additional treat was the flyover by Flight for Life. A few of the members who answered the call back in '06 are still on the team. They have been flying over for the past few years, but none of us realized who it was. This year however, they made their presence known by circling the field several times, as the thousands on the ground waved to them.

There were many highlights that day and I'll share one that stands out the most:

"Be a Domino Pusher" suggested Dr. Benke, guest speaker at Platte Canyon. Dr. Benke is the Math Teacher that tackled the shooter at Deer Creek Middle School in Littleton early this year. He explained that during a crisis, usually bystanders just watch in stunned amazement. That is, until someone reacts, then others get involved. Thus, the Domino theory. "I wasn't going to let the Deer Creek incident ruin my life. We all need to practice random acts of kindness," he added.

The suggested donation per rider and per entrant in the 5K was \$20 this year. (Although not mandatory. The Keyes theory is that "Everybody rides that wants to!") Proceeds in years past have gone to the "A-6"- (the "Anonymous 6" were the other girls in the room that day.) local non-profit agencies and now, for the SRP.

The Standard Response Protocol is a clear and concise safety plan of action that the Keyes developed. After attending numerous safety conferences, they noticed a gaping hole with the language of emergency responders. Thus, the SRP was born.

In place in over 500 schools in Colorado and in several states back east, the SRP is accessible and available to all... for FREE.

The one school district for the SRP that stands out the most is New York City. Over a million students will learn the four basic actions for safety. (John Michael is flying out today to help get the program in place.)

I find it amazing that such a beneficial safety program, (that could feasibly effect schools across the nation,) evolved from such a tragic event, in lil' ol' Bailey.
