TWIN ROCKS

Twin Rocks is composed of basalt formed from ancient volcanic activity. At one time, the entire area including what is now the Coast Range, was an undersea marine environment and part of the continental shelf, just as the ocean floor off the coast is today.

OCEAN'S EDGE WAYSIDE-

Located between 1st Ave at Hwy 101 and S Pacific St. This is the most visible of all the beach access points and sits in the center of town. This is the spot where the Salt Water Natatorium once stood.

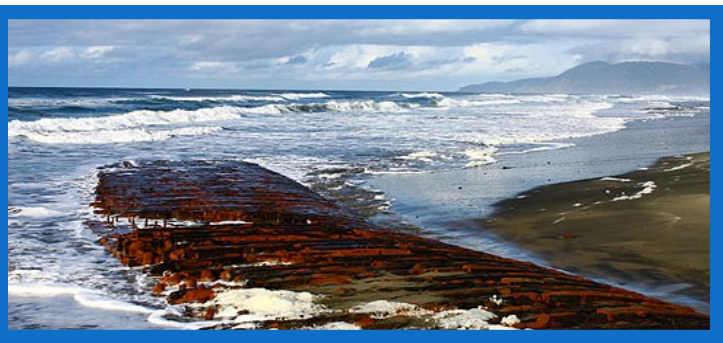


MANHATTAN BEACH, BEACH ST.

Off U.S. Highway 101, turn west at the Manhattan Beach sign on Beach Street. The beach access at the end of the street at Beach Drive.

NEHALEM BAY SOUTH JETTY - BEACH DRIVE

To get to the jetty, your only access is Beach Drive, which comes off Beach Street from U.S. Highway 101 at the Manhattan Beach turn. The jetty access is at Section Line Street and Beach Drive. The access path to the beach is marked by the monument sign, which states "Nehalem Bay south Jetty, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Constructed 1910-1916."



EMILY G REED ~ FOR OVER 100 YEARS THIS ANCIENT SHIP WRECK

Has played peek-a-boo in the coastal sands off Rockaway Beach for more than 100 years. The Emily G Reed ran aground in 1908, footsteps from Rockaway's downtown. It can be seen in the sand when the tide is low and the storms are strong (usually during winter months).

The Pacific Railway and Navigation line ran and the first train from Portland arrived in Tillamook in October, 1911. The railroad was the vital factor in the development of the Rockaway area.

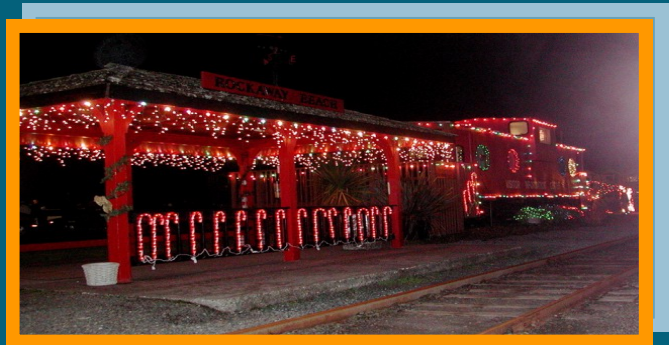
The train from Portland back in the teens and 20's was the main mode of transportation to the coastal communities. It was an all day, dusty, long trip by car over gravel and plank roads, so the old steam trains played an important role in those early days. The train left Portland around 9 am and arrived in the Rockaway area about 2:30 pm. An extra engine was used to help it over the summit.

The City limits of Rockaway Beach now encompasses the subdivisions or town sites from north to south named Manhattan, Highland Park Addition to Manhattan, Moroney Town, Lake Lytle, Beal's Addition to Lake Lytle, Seaview Park, Rockaway Beach, Elmore Park, Tillamook Beach (known as Saltair), Midway Beach, Twin Rocks, and a small portion of Ocean Lake Park. Information about these developments was gleaned from old abstracts, plat filings and records, as well as the stories of the early settlers and "summer people."

HOMESTEADING

In the 1900's . . . Before the jetties were built there was a wide sandy beach all the way from Garibaldi to Nehalem Bay, known as "Garibaldi Beaches." This beach served as the only access to this area which was then The area remained nearly isolated to all but a few hearty souls who would drive up the beach by horse and wagon or walk during low tide.

After several unsuccessful plans for a railroad line from Portland to Tillamook, the Pacific Railway and Navigation Company opened 1906. Thanks to Elmer E. Lytle. The first steam engine was delivered 1907. The coastal land homestead claims, once considered near worthless, took on a new value and a flurry of subdividing into town sites took place from 1909 on.



The first passenger train came to Rockaway in 1912. In those days it was quite an occasion when the Friday afternoon train arrived bringing the daddies who were joining their families for the week-end, thus earning the name of "Daddy-Train."

Today you will find "The Little Red Caboose" that serves as the Rockaway Beach Chamber of Commerce office set up at the Ocean's Edge Wayside as a symbol and tribute to these beginnings.

OLD GROWTH CEDAR NATURE PRESERVE

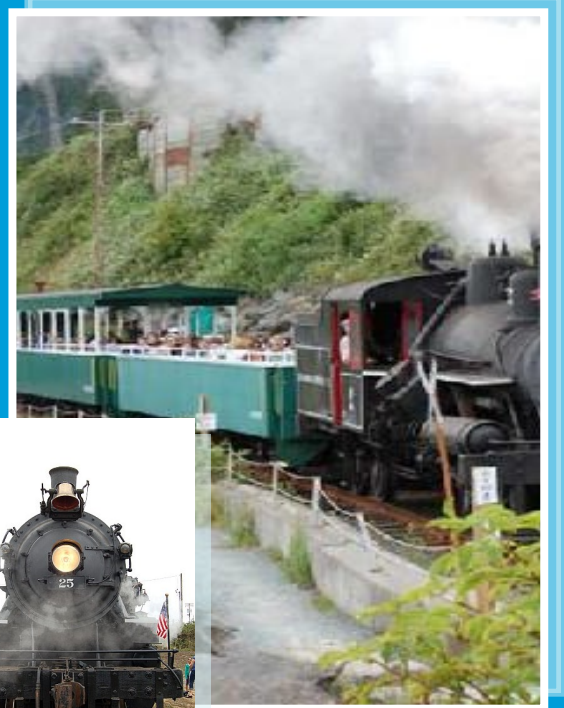


OREGON COAST SCENIC RAILROAD

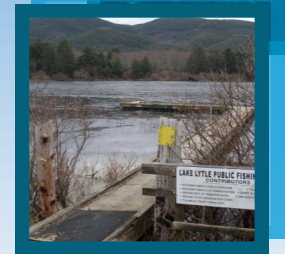
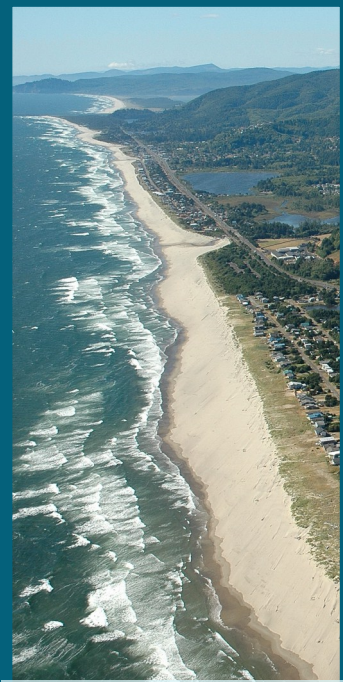

- ◆ **Nedonna Lake & White Dove Pond:** In the Nedonna Beach area & these lakes are stocked with rainbow trout by ODWF on a regular basis.
- ◆ **Crescent Lake:** Just N of Lake Lytle, separated from U.S. Hwy 101 by private property. NE Lake Blvd. skirts the woods around the lake to both N & E.
- ◆ **Lake Lytle:** The largest lake in Rockaway Beach. It offers a boat launch. Offer many types of fish it is a fun family fishing or Kayaking spot.
- ◆ **Seaview Lake:** located in the middle of Rockaway Beach. Our newest joint project spearheaded by the local Rockaway Lions Club & ODWF.
- ◆ **Lake Marie:** A small lake just east of Hwy 101 between Minnehaha & Washington St. Stranger Memorial Park & the Community Garden.
- ◆ **Spring Lake:** Extreme caution parking. Stocked with of Bass, Steelhead & Trout, located at the S end of Rockaway Beach on the E side of Hwy 101.
- ◆ **Rockaway Beach City Park:** Covering 4 city blocks, SeaviewPark is a lovely spot for all ages. The park is two blocks east of U.S. Hwy 101 & a block N of N 3rd A
- ◆ **Ed Hart Park:** A charming little park stands on the site that was formerly the home of one of Rockaway's pioneers - Mrs. Edith Hart. The address is 19820 Breaker Ave. which is just north of W Washington St for all to enjoy.
- ◆ **Kelly's Brighton Marina & Jetty Fishery:** a few miles north of Rockaway, both offer boat rentals, dock crabbing, RV rental spots, live seafood for sale & food to go
