The Career and Technical Education Committee is touring various CTE centers around the Country.

A visit was held last month to Cincinnati. According to Chamber

President Barry Wilfahrt who is part of the group "Other states are way ahead of us in bringing hands on technical education to high school students" Why does this matter? "It is important to show high school students there are many high skilled and high wage occupations available to them right out of high school or after pursing a technical college degree." Trade occupations now require certifications and



very specialized training. They are quickly becoming very highly paid positions in some of the most in demand occupation areas.

In addition to Great Oaks in Cincinnati, visits to Norman, OK and Sioux Falls are planned. According to Becca Cruger, Workforce Development Director at the EDC, who is spearheading the project; "A grant was revived by the EDC to do a survey of High school students, investigate with other cities are doing and them bring a back a recommended course of action for Grand Forks."

The state of North Dakota funded \$70 million for CTE in North Dakota Communities with applications due later this year. Watch for a complete roll out of a plan later this year.






