Major infrastructure Keeps Moving Forward

First, the Chamber submitted a letter of support for the City of Grand Forks Federal funding request for the 42nd underpass at Demers. The City of Grand Forks is doing a great job taking the lead on this project. The NEPA is also close to complete on the 47th I-29 interchange. The in town bridge subcommittee has selected an engineering firm to help lead them through the process of selecting a corridor and coordinating between the two cities and two states.

Finally, members of the Chamber Infrastructure Committee along with south end businesses and farmers formally requested Grand Forks County take the lead and also begin the NEPA process on an Interchange on I-29 at Merrifield road. The County Commission voted to begun this process.





The CPSP teaches participants the cycle a client or prospect goes through in the purchase process and teaches how to identify a client's preferred style of communication and how to speak to that. The program focuses on skills such as improving communication one-on-one, in groups, and in meetings; helping guide prospects through the process; and effectively utilizing customer-centric communication. To earn the certification, each person had to complete modules for 45 consecutive days and pass a written exam.

Merit Award: Grand Forks Cities Area Transit Expansion & Renovation


As a public transportation system serving both sides of the river since 1934, Cities Area Transit (CAT) required a renovation that would pay homage to its past and provide a dynamic workplace culture that honored its occupants. The prior transit facility was built in 1984 and lacked natural light, administration space, and square footage to accommodate the growing needs of maintenance, equipment, and bus storage for their commuting community.

CAT's addition and renovation provided an open floor plan that directs natural light throughout the entire facility - enhancing the employee experience while reducing energy use and cost of construction. JLG also created a circulation loop "road" design connecting the departments and articulating a welcoming path for both employees and visitors. To generate an immersive experience, JLG integrated a suspended mezzanine, raw steel panel mapping, historical bus transit graphics, and public transportation signage at every stop on the building's route. CAT redefines civic architecture with a vibrant workplace that welcomes community and reflects the facility's long legacy of public service.
