Chamber Board Chair elect, Tony Hodny noted the focus on youth sports tournaments in these new facilities also makes economic sense.


Chamber President, Barry Wilfahrt compared the plan to refinancing your house to include some home improvements.

The ND Mill and Elevator hosted nearly 30 local business people and community leaders for this years Agribusiness City to Farm Tour. The Agribusiness City to Farm tour is aimed to bring together local business people and community leaders. Such events play a crucial role in strengthening the agricultural community and contributing to the growth and prosperity of the local economy.

The group toured the impressive ND Mill on Mill Rd. The facility plays a crucial role in the agricultural industry. As the largest flour mill in the United States, it boasts ten milling units, a terminal elevator, and a packing warehouse to handle the processing and shipment of milled products.

On a daily basis, the Mill produces and ships an impressive 60,500 hundredweight (cwt) of milled products. Additionally, it ships over 17,000 cwt of food-grade bran and wheat midds each day. This reflects the significant volume and scale of operations at the facility.

Overall, the ND Mill and Elevator is a critical player in the agricultural and food processing industry, making substantial contributions to the local economy and the broader agricultural community in North Dakota and beyond.

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
