Community leaders spent a day at the Pentagon visiting with Air Force Undersecretaries for Intelligence Surveillance and Reconnaissance and Installations and the Vice Chief nominee for the Air Force. The status of current missions, base infrastructure and a new mission were all talking points during the productive discussions.

Chamber Receives Base Retention Grant

The ND Department of Commerce awarded The Chamber \$250,000 for the biennium for the Mayor's Base Retention Committee efforts. The money will be used to explore, evaluate and pursue new mission opportunities at GFAFB and assess current and future base infrastructure as it relates to mission recruitment and retention. The Mayor's Committee meets monthly and includes: Mayor Bochenski; Air Force Civic leader Bruce Gjovig, ACC Civic Leader and Chamber CEO, Barry Wilfahrt; Chamber MAC Chair and State Senator, Scott Meyer; and County Commissioner, Dave Engen.

Team GF already making preparations for 2025 Legislative Session

Planning for the 2025 legislative session has already started. UAS infrastructure, base retention funding, UND infrastructure, state funding for Twining school, additional funds for the Discovery Center are all on the radar at this early point. Meetings with local legislators will take place in April and December of next year and the Chamber is planning to take a delegation to Williston and Tioga in mid-July to meet with Western ND leaders and see what is happening in the oil industry out west.

Annual Meeting Set for January 25th

Plan now to attend and watch for more details on the Chamber Annual Meeting coming up on January 25th.

Chamber Board Chair, Russel Crary will turn the gavel over to incoming Chair, Tony Hodny. The program will feature two panels on emerging opportunities in the Grand Forks economy. The first will be on Bioscience opportunities and will be facilitated by Todd Forkel, Altru CEO. UND President, Andy Armocost will facilitate the second panel on AI and Cyber opportunities.

The night will be capped off with the presentation of the prestigious Henry Havig Award for a lifetime of volunteer and community service.



EGF EDA Planning Session Yields EGF Plan for Future Growth

Helping existing East Grand Forks Businesses expand and developing resources to address community issues such as housing, workforce, child care and quality of life were identified as the top two priority areas for EGF. Success will be defined by growth in the tax base and increasing sales tax receipts, population growth, more housing starts and growth of business establishments. The chamber working with the EGF Economic Development Authority is developing an aggressive "to do" list for 2024-2026 to make these things happen.

Recent Sales Tax Vote a huge boost For Quality of Life

By a 2/3 majority Grand Forks Voters passed the extension of a ³/₄ sales tax to fund a variety of quality of life initiatives including ongoing upgrades. The regional market capture analysis and geofencing led by the Chamber right before the pandemic evidenced just how important major event facilities are for the local economy. Quality of life amenities continue to be one of the key factors in workforce recruitment which continues to be the number one issue facing local businesses. Congratulations to the City and Park District on this victory.

Next fall voters in East Grand Forks will vote on a sales tax increase for several park district facilities that will also add to quality of life opportunities for area resident. The MN Legislature approved putting this proposal to EGF voters during the 2023 legislative session.
