The wow moment came when Tom Swoyer talked about the average salary of the 400 plus jobs at Grand Sky - \$123,000 average salary. This is a big number and the kind of jobs that benefit every chamber member business according to Russel Crary, 2023 Chamber Board Chair. More than 100 additional similar jobs will be added in 2023.

Space Development Agency's Dr. Derrick Tournear talked about the low earth orbit satellite mission that will be operation at GFAFB in 2024. George Rumford the director of Test Resource Management Center talked about the "Range Hawk" mobile test range that will be run out of Grand Sky. Northrop Grumman is converting the retiring Block 20 and 30 Global Hawks. Senators Hoeven and Cramer played a major role in securing both of these missions.

According to Chamber President, Barry Wilfahrt the Community and States investment in Grand Sky and the UAS industry is starting to really pay off. We have momentum and need to double down on our efforts. Our Legislative asks certainly do that with \$30M requested for the ND UAS Test Site and \$22M for the next tranche of infrastructure at Grand Sky in front of the ND Legislature this session.




