- EGF Park Department the LaFave park plan was detailed. Will require a sale tax which is being considered at the legislature this session
- Northland attendance figures for Fall Semester are looking positive; the bonding Bill with has some major improvements for labs at northland included in it.
- The Chamber With Safe and Sick Time and Paid Leave Bills racing through the legislature the MN business climate in on track to be the worst in state's history compared to neighboring ND.
- MN Dist 1 Senator Mark Johnson the session is moving very rapidly with virtually no discussion on any Bills which is not how the process should work to ensure the best outcomes for Minnesotans.

#### Update on Bridges

The City of EGF has been strongly promoting the two cities and two counties fund a consulting firm to walk the four government entities thought the bridge site selection and funding process. Last week Polk County joined the two cities and agreed to fund its share of the process. On March 7th Grand Forks County will discuss and hopefully act favorable on funding this process so the bridge location and funding process can move forward while both MN and ND have federal funds and surpluses available.

The connections between our two cities is vital with over 1,500

people crossing in each direction between our two cities to work every day. Previous studies have shown just how many hours of driving time would be saved with an in town bridge location and the increased safety a Merrifield bridge prove by taking much of the truck traffic out of the downtown.

Our success at the legislature every two years has tremendous impact every single business in Grand Forks.

On our agenda this year is Career Technical Education funding, Lift Funds for expanding and new businesses, Grand Sky and the UAS Test Site expansion and operations funding; I-29 interchange funding; workforce program funding; the Governors Destination Fund which could support the planned Children's Museum in Grand Forks; Red River Valley water supply funding; plus a whole list of priorities for UND like scholarships, National Security Corridor funding, and research funding.



A favorite local coffee shop is hoping to fill up more than just mugs this March. Bully Brew Coffee is teaming up with Northland Community and Technical College to host a food drive during the month of March in an effort to fully stock the shelves of Pioneer Pantry, Northland's newly opened on-campus food pantry. Northland's Phi Theta Kappa honor students led the coordination with Bully Brew Coffee East Grand Forks to organize the event.

Sandi Luck, Founder and CEO of North Dakota Coffee Roastery and Bully Brew, has long used her multiple business ventures as a way to stay connected with the communities she serves. Giving back is one way she's been able to support local causes like Pioneer Pantry.

"We teamed up with Northland last year to develop the college's own brand of coffee called Rocket Fuel, which we used as a fundraiser and newsmaker for Northland," Luck said. Food insecurity is a challenge for approximately one-third of all college students. While never having a formal program in place, Northland always provided assistance to students who requested it or connected students with local food pantries to help meet their needs.
