High Water Reminds us of the Importance of Major Transportation Infrastructure

The high water this spring once again reminds us building new and upgrading our roadways is just as important than ever. The Chamber Board continues to strongly advocate for four major infrastructure projects:

- 1. 42nd street underpass at Demers
- 2. New I-29 Interchange near 47th Ave S
- 3. In- town Bridge connecting GF and EGF
- 4. Merrifield Bridge and connecting roads and a new interchange at I-29

Each of these projects is at one stage or another in the planning process and the 1-4 listing above also corresponds to where each is at in the overall environmental work at this point. Grand Forks City Council is taking the lead on project 1 and 2 and the NEPA (environmental assessment) is nearly complete for both projects.

During the legislative session significant funding was approved to fund some major projects like these. The two city and counties have also hired a firm to lead them through an intercity bridge selection process.

According to Chamber Past Board Chair, Tommy Kenville "with all of the Federal infrastructure money it is absolutely critical everyone cooperate and we get this work done".




