Legislative Luncheon

Current Legislators and legislative candidates from throughout Grand Forks County gathered at the Chamber office last week to begin planning for the 2025 legislative session. They were joined by The Chamber, EDC, UND, City and County leaders.

Chamber Government Affairs Co-Chairs Garth Rydland, Valley Senior Living and Stacey Dahl, Minnkota Power both emphasized how important it is for our entire delegation to be on the same page of priorities for Grand Forks to continue the legislative success that has resulted in over \$1.3B in state funding coming back to Grand Forks for a whole list of infrastructure projects over the past decade.

On the horizon for 2025 is funding for such things as city infrastructure and quality of life items like the discovery Center; UAS Funding at Grand Sky, base retention funding, workforce and business development funding and several others. Finally, for UND the big priorities at this point are:

I-29 Interchange at 47th Ave Approved

The US DOT approved a new interchange access at S 47th St on I-29 in South Grand Forks. This has been one of the five top transportation infrastructure priorities for the Chamber since 2019 when the Chamber's Infrastructure Committee was formed. The other four are the already in process 42nd underpass at Demers, an Interstate interchange at Merrifield Road, A bridge over the Red River at Merrifield road and an in town bridge. All five projects are necessary to keep our region connected, efficient and growing.

Congratulations to Mayor Bochenski, City Council and the City's engineering department including City Engineer, Al Grasser and Asst. City Engineer, David Kuharenko who spearheaded this effort along with City Administrator, Todd Feland. This is a positive step for growth of our community.

The Chamber would also like to recognize Dave Zavoral, RJ Zavoral and Sons and Sally Miskavige, Opp Construction who have chaired The Chamber Infrastructure committee since its inception. Also a big thanks to former GF Senator Lonnie Laffen and Senator Curt Kreun who each introduced Bills over the years calling for state funding of the 47th St Interchange. Both kept this project on the front burner for years while City leadership and the MPO worked with the DOT on technical details.

Chamber staff has submitted letters of support for and attended hearings for all five projects over the years. The Infrastructure Committee will continue its work with the Cities, Counties and MPO.

Business Day at the Capitol

Business people from across Minnesota travelled to St Paul last month to meet with their local legislators to express their concerns relating to the ever changing business climate. It is clearly more difficult to business in Minnesota today than at any time in history. The messages were clear: Stop over regulating and over taxing businesses and the people of Minnesota.

Minot AFB Tour

40 ND Legislators Toured Minot Air Force Base last month. The group saw the B52 and missile launch missions and the many changes both are undergoing. According to Chamber President Barry Wilfahrt who received a special invitation to the event as an Air Force Civic Leader "The Minot AFB Minuteman missile modernization program (the Sentinel project) is of particular interest to ND and especially western North Dakota." He also noted many legislators will be in Grand Forks as part of the annual UAS summit in October. The kickoff event is traditionally held at Grand Sky. "this is a great opportunity to show the legislators how Grand Sky, UAS and GFAFB benefit all north Dakotans."

The Chamber's and Base Retention Committees in Grand Forks, Minot and Fargo are working together the ND Congressional Delegation to ensure Department of Defense missions and installations are supported and sustained.

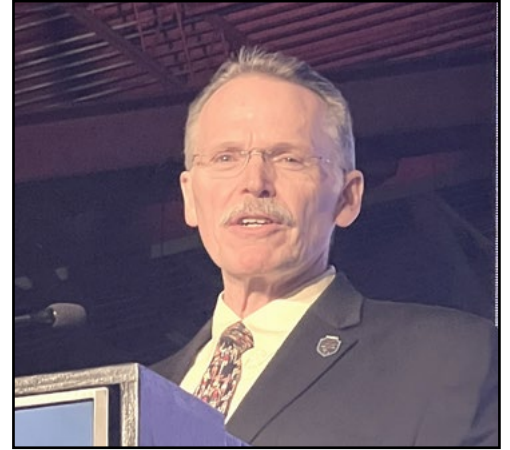
Chamber Board Chair Tony Hodny and Chamber President & CEO, Barry Wilfahrt both offered positive testimony during Epitome Energy's air permit hearing last week. This is the final major step to approval of the Soybean Crushing operation which is slated to be built just east of the waste water treatment pond on the far North end of Grand Forks. The \$500 million value added agriculture project is slated to break ground in early 2025 and operational by harvest in 2026.

Shari Olson Named Interim President of Northland Community & Technical College

The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities has named Shari Olson to serve as interim president of Northland Community & Technical College. The appointment becomes effective July 1, 2024.

“With her deep knowledge of Minnesota State, including her previous leadership role with Northland, I am confident Dr. Olson is the right person to provide leadership during this transition,” said Scott Olson, chancellor of Minnesota State. “She will make tremendous contributions to the well-being of Northland Community & Technical College — promoting a culture of collaboration and continuous innovation and improvement. I’m grateful that Shari is willing to take on this challenge and I look forward to working closely with her as she positions Northland for success well into the future.”

Dr. Olson is an experienced educator committed to the role that comprehensive community and technical colleges play in our society and brings with her a passion for continuous learning and self-improvement.

In her most recent role, she served as president of South Mountain Community College (AZ) from 2011 until her retirement in 2022. Under her leadership, the college achieved several important milestones, including a 10-year reaffirmation of Higher Learning Commission (HLC) accreditation, securing a Department of Education Title V grant of nearly \$3 million, receiving HLC approval to offer a Bachelor of Science program in Behavioral Science, opening the SMCC Science Complex after a \$19 million remodeling, and recognition by the Aspen Institute as one of the nation’s top 150 community colleges four times from 2015 to 2021.

Previously, she served as interim president of Anoka Technical College from 2010 to 2011 where her many accomplishments included facilitating the creation of the college master technology plan and redesigning the organizational structure to maximize employee talent and create efficiencies. In 2011, she was recognized by the Minnesota State College Student Association (now called LeadMN) with the President of the Year award.

Dr. Olson succeeds Sandra Kiddoo who has served as Northland’s president since 2021 and chose not to renew her contract.
