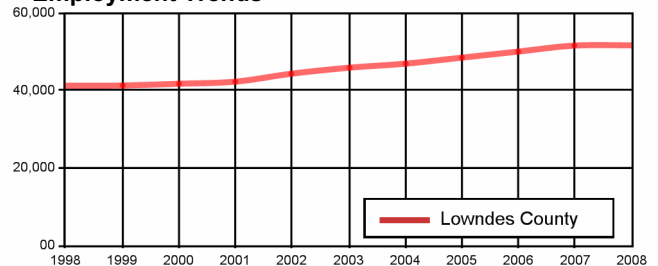

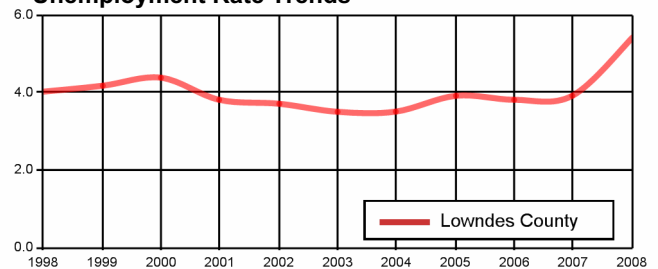

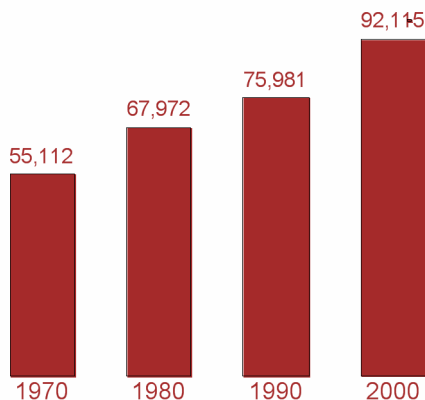

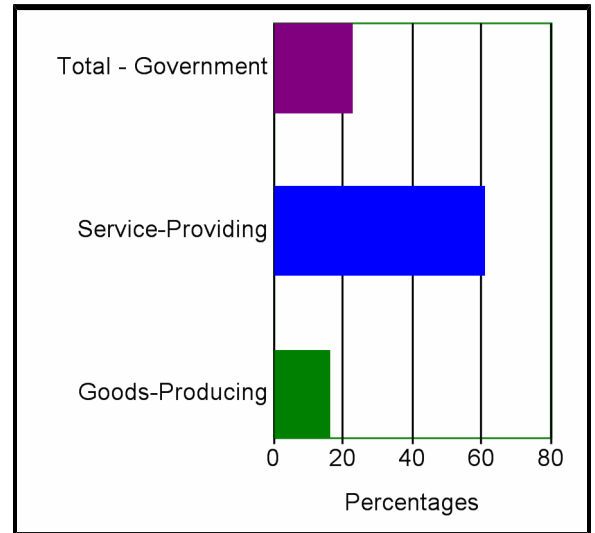
## Lowndes Per Capita Income
