How Not To Go Out Of Business In Six Months

I am always very impressed with people who open their own business. Discovering a need in a community, figuring out how to meet that need, finding a location, ordering the right inventory, hiring the right people, getting utilities connected, business cards, business permits, signage - all of the little things that must be considered. All before the first dime of revenue is realized. Entrepreneurs spend days and weeks and months planning for that first day of business - then have no idea why no one shows up. 
