RULES FOR INDIVIDUAL ENTRIES

1. All articles except student art, (Class I) and baked goods (Class V) must be checked in at the fairgrounds on **Sunday, October 4** between the hours of 2:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m.
2. Baked goods **MUST** be brought to the fairground between the hours of **7:30a.m. and 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, October 6, 2015**
3. Student art exhibits must be entered through each student's school. **Homeschool students** should bring their entries to the **Extension office** on Friday, September 19, 2015
4. Only one entry per person may be made under each class, category, and lot.
5. Competent judges will be secured. Their decision will be final.
6. Payment for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners will be made on Sunday, October 11th from 2:00 —4:00 p.m. by cash. **Exhibits MUST** remain throughout the entire week of the fair in order to receive prize money. Exhibit items **MUST be picked up on Sunday, October 11, 2015 from 2:00—4:00 p.m. Any unclaimed items WILL BE DISCARDED!**
7. A food exhibitor must enter whole cake, five or more cookies, or a whole pie. All baked goods will be sold as a donation to support the Washington County 4-H Club programs.
8. Exhibit all clothing items on clothes hangers.
9. Judging will be conducted on four points: quality, appropriateness, cleanliness and workmanship.
10. Judging in Food Preservation will be done according to: appearance, texture, uniformity, pack and container.
11. Food Preservation should be entered in standard glass canning jars and sealed.
12. Exhibit items will **ONLY** be accepted at locations and times listed above.
13. Entry must have not been entered in previous fairs.
