Free dementia series held this fall @ the library

This fall learn about dementia behavior, early detection and final stages at the Library. Registration online is recommended but not required for each of these free programs.

The first of the series will be led by Nurse Jackie Widges from Willowbrook highlighting *Dementia Basics: Understanding Brain Changes* on Thursday, September 5th at 6:30 p.m. The program will discuss behavior of those who

have been diagnosed with dementia and address the most frequently

asked question posed by family members: "why are they acting that way?" This presentation will walk attendees through the function of the different areas of the brain and what behavior changes occur with different types of dementia.

Part two of the series will be led by Elizabeth Hagemann, Manager of Education & Community Volunteers of the Alzheimer's Association. Ms. Hagemann will talk

about how to Know the 10 Signs: Early Detection Matters— Thursday, October 3rd at 6:30 p.m. Ms. Hageman will highlight warning signs of Alzheimer's disease. Attendees will hear from people who have the disease, find out how to recognize the warning signs in yourself and others, and learn why early detection matters.

The final part of the series Advance Directives: What are they and who needs them? will be held on Thursday, November 14th at 6:30 p.m. with Nurse Practitioner Amy Ladd from Hospice of Wabash Valley. Ms. Ladd will answer questions such as:

What is an advance directive? Who should have one? What are the consequences of not having one?"

Clark County Historical Society hosts anthropology and archaeology enthusiast Elmer A. Guerri as he presents: "The Mystique and the Magic of Cahokia" on Thursday, September 26 from 6:30—8:00 p.m. in

the library's Dale McConchie meeting room. Elmer has conducted classes and lectures at Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, Indiana State University's Osher Lifelong Learning Institute and other schools and colleges about the latest Cahokia discoveries and learn-

ings.

Some of the topics he will discuss are: Why is it important to study Cahokia? What was happening elsewhere in the world when Cahokia was flourishing?




Book Chat's 'Book of the Month'
