

OHIO ASTRONAUT WING (Famous Ohio Astronauts)

John Glenn – John Herschel Glenn Jr. was a United States Marine Corps aviator, engineer, astronaut, businessman and politician. He was the third American in space, and the first American to orbit the Earth, circling it three times in 1962.

<u>Judith Resnik</u> – Judith Arlene Resnik was an American electrical engineer, software engineer, biomedical engineer, pilot and NASA astronaut who died aboard the Space Shuttle Challenger when it was destroyed in 1986.

Neil Armstrong - Neil Alden Armstrong was an American astronaut and aeronautical engineer, and the first person to walk on the Moon. He was also a naval aviator, test pilot, and university professor.

OHIO INVENTOR WING (Famous Ohio Inventors)

Thomas Edison – Thomas Alva Edison was an American inventor who developed devices in fields such as electric power generation, mass communication, sound recording, and motion pictures. Inventions include the phonograph, the motion picture camera, and early versions of the electric light bulb.

Garrett Morgan – Garrett Augustus Morgan, Sr. was an African-American inventor, businessman, and community leader. His most notable inventions were a three-position traffic signal and a smoke hood (predecessor of the gas mask) notably used in a 1916 tunnel construction disaster rescue.

Wright Brothers - The Wright brothers—Orville and Wilbur —were two American aviation pioneers generally credited with inventing, building, and flying the world's first successful motor-operated airplane.
