## Trail Etiquette For All Users

Welcome to the South Park Non-Motorized Trail System. In order to make the trail safe and enjoyable for all users, simply follow these rules for proper trail etiquette.

### Common Courtesy

- ◆ Respect all trail restrictions and recommendations
- ◆ Be courteous of all other users regardless of their sport, speed or skill level
- ◆ Keep speeds low around other recreationists and slow down when sight lines are poor
- ◆ Avoid riding/hiking during and after heavy rains or wet conditions
- ◆ Keep pets on a leash or under control
- ◆ Stay on the trail
- ◆ Keep your ears open—no ear buds for an MP3 player or iPod
- ◆ Please do not cut switchbacks or take short cuts

### Yielding

- ◆ What does **“Yield”** mean? Yielding means to slow down, establish communication, be prepared to stop and pass in a safe and friendly manner.
- ◆ Yield to horses
  - ⇒ Stay downhill
  - ⇒ Greet the rider
  - ⇒ Ask how to proceed
- ◆ Stay to the right and pass on the left
- ◆ Give a clear warning signal when passing: call out “passing on your left”
- ◆ Allow plenty of space when others are passing
- ◆ Yield to other trail-users when entering and crossing trails

Recommended use for the Cascade trail is hiking only from the Trailhead to the Cascade bridges



**Equestrians**

- ◆ Be sure you can control your horse and it has been exposed to other trail recreational users
- ◆ Be prepared to let other trail enthusiasts know what needs to be done to keep you, the horse and other trail riders safe when you meet on the trail
- ◆ Always pick up after your horse; keep the trailheads and parking area clear of manure



**Hikers**

- ◆ Yield to equestrians
- ◆ When encountering horses on the trail, stop, call ahead and make yourself known to the rider. Ask them if it is OK to pass and the best way to do so
- ◆ When hiking in a group, hike single file



**Mountain Bikers**

- ◆ Yield to hikers and equestrians
- ◆ Its recommended bikers wear bells to warn horses
- ◆ When approaching horses from behind, stop, call ahead and make yourself known to the rider. Ask them if it is OK to pass and the best way to do so
- ◆ Control your bike, be ready and able to stop at any time
- ◆ Do not slide around corners
- ◆ Watch your speed around blind corners



**IMPORTANT: MOTOR VEHICLE USE**

The South Park Trails Map is designed to be used with the Motor Vehicle Use Maps (MVUM) for the Plumas National Forest. The MVUM show National Forest System roads, National Forest System trails, and the areas on the National Forest System lands in the Plumas National Forest that are designated for motor vehicle use pursuant to 36 CFR 12.21.

National Forest road, trail, and area users must comply with the Motor Vehicle Use Map, as well as Federal, State, and local laws and regulations. Compliance with these rules is the responsibility of the user.
