

The Household Water Well Program helps ensure that rural homeowners have access to wells that are safe and functional.

Since 2010, Golden Triangle RC&D has partnered with USDA Rural Development to install or repair water wells for low income households in Southwest Georgia.

What is the Household Water Well Program?

The Household Water Well Program is a low-interest loan for homeowners needing to repair, replace or service their household well system. Loan terms are for 10 years at 1% interest annually and there is no fee for early repayment.

Who is eligible for the loan?

Residents of Southwest Georgia including Baker, Calhoun, Clay, Colquitt, Decatur, Early, Grady, Miller, Mitchell, Quitman, Randolph, Seminole, Stewart, Thomas, Terrell and Worth Counties are eligible for the loan. Applicants must own and reside in the home and must qualify as low income.

Newly built homes and homes that are connected to public water sources are not eligible. The loan excludes installation of home plumbing, sewer or septic systems. Agricultural wells are not eligible.

How can I apply?

Applications are available at local health departments or on the Golden Triangle RC&D website (www.goldentrianglercd.org/waterwell). Completed applications and a copy of the deed of trust or certificate of title for the home, health department site inspection and a minimum of two bids from a licensed and bonded well service contractor should be submitted to Golden Triangle RC&D. Once approved, the home owner will complete a loan agreement with Golden Triangle RC&D. The contractor will begin work after the loan is approved. After the work is complete and inspected by the health department, the contractor will be paid and the loan repayment will begin at the first of the month following completion.
