"These 'GED Cafés' will be created in secure locations to support an individual's desire to obtain their GED."

"With these funds, our program will be able to place computers in partner locations to allow individuals that cannot travel to our sites the opportunity to participate in online classes to achieve their goal of obtaining their GED."
